UTAS Medical Science Precinct, Medical Science I
17 Liverpool Street, Hobart

See the building that accommodates the Menzies Research Institute Tasmania and the School of Medicine. Listen to one of the archaeologists talk about the dig that occurred on site before construction commenced, and see some of the artefacts on display. Architect Adrian Stanic will talk about the inspiration and design of the building. Look around the lower two floors of MS1 and view heritage-listed Hollydene House. Guided tours of the medical research lab will also be conducted.

All Saints Church 339 Macquarie Street, South Hobart

Visit the All Saints Church and learn about the church's history and architecture. See the vestments and church silver on display while being entertained by short music recitals. Art Deco Walking Tour Various sites in Hobart

This guided tour, led by local Art Deco enthusiasts, will view Art Deco buildings in the Hobart CBD area including the former Hydro-Electric Commission Head Office, the T&G building, hotels and office buildings, apartments and more. Hear about the architectural merits of these places and learn about the Art Deco style as it applied in Hobart.

This walk covers several city blocks. A reasonable level of fitness and suitable walking shoes are recommended.

Cornelian Bay Cemetery and Crematorium Queens Walk, Cornelian Bay

There are two different tours on offer by Millingtons, the current operator, at the Cornelian Bay Cemetery and Crematorium. One will be a 45-minute tour of the crematorium, including an explanation of its operations. The second tour will be a 60 minute tour of the historic cemetery. There will also be genealogy search demonstrations; and displays of vintage and modern hearses, coffins, monuments, memorials and crypts. Millingtons' staff will also be on hand to explain all aspects of the funeral process, crematorium and cemetery.

Former Bruny Island Council Chambers 3915 Bruny Island Main Road, Alonnah, Bruny Island

Hear about the history of the former Bruny Island Council Chambers and the Island from the enthusiastic members of the Bruny Island Historical Society and see their collection of memorabilia. Look through their family records and discover if your family ever lived on Bruny Island.

Ogilvie High School 228 New Town Road, New Town

Visit Ogilvie High School and meet with a local architect who will describe the key architectural features of the building.

Tour inside the school and observe its unusual design. Meet old scholars of the school who will relive their school days and view a display of archival items such as old school uniforms, school books and reports. Memorabilia items will also be available for purchase.

The event begins at 11am with a talk by a visiting architect. This will be followed by small group tours and the opportunity to view exhibits.

Masonic Centre 3 Sandy Bay Road, Sandy Bay

This tour provides a rare opportunity to see the beautiful Temples (now known as Meeting Rooms) of a Masonic Lodge. Some members of the Freemasons will dress in full regalia as they explain the history of Freemasonry and show you through the Temples and other parts of the building. Local architect and author, Barry McNeill, will be available to discuss the architectural aspects of this beautiful building which was designed by Lauriston Crisp.

Pius X Catholic Church 98 Channel Highway, Tarooma

This delightful suburban church was designed by J H E Dorney and is widely accepted as the first modernist church in Australia. Learn about its history and architecture and see the carved crucifix and statue made by Tasmanian artists.

Esmond Dorney's son, Paddy (also an architect), will be on site to explain the architectural features of the church.

State Cinema 375 Elizabeth Street, North Hobart

Visit the cinema and learn about its history. Have a tour of the building; see the original pressed tin ceiling and projection room which contains old and new technologies; and see a short film at the end of the tour!

Talk to the dedicated and well informed fire-fighters about their museum and the history of the Fire Service in Tasmania.
